An extended lockdown becomes more likely in the U.K. as the death toll increases. Further Grade 12 traditions such as the tube photo and graduation could also be canceled.

The prospect of missing out on the typical graduation ceremony at Westminster Hall is saddening for de Beer. She said her family members were planning to travel to London to celebrate the event.

"I have been thinking about this, and I'd definitely be really upset because it's something that I've been looking forward to my whole life. I don't say this lightly. truly mean it," she said.

De Beer said one potential option for graduation discussed during a senior council meeting was through Zoom.

"[We] were thinking of doing small break-out rooms in advisory or in friend groups first just to say a few words, and for everyone to get to [reflect on] senior year," she said. "We would then all tune into a live stream where [Principal Devin Ganeshananthan] would give us a final speech and a final goodbye.

However, de Beer would like to "postpone rather than cancel" or have a virtual graduation. A main reason de Beer wants to postpone graduation is to say goodbye to her teachers one final time.

"That's the hardest part of this all: teachers who you don't have classes with that you would normally just see on a daily basis," she said. "Now, there is no way of getting in contact with them if you don't have a Zoom meeting."

Cornelius said he thinks the best form of saying goodbye to teachers given the circumstances is by "pursuing the passion for learning [that] we all have.

"The best goodbye that we can have with our teachers is continuing to work and pursue our academics, he said.






