









the BOOK

"Better in Bold" was conceptualized at the Balfour workshop in Orlando and further developed through the first part of the school year. It is meant to be a reflection on the students at our school and a statement about our student body - despite our "boring" uniforms we are actually vibrant in own way through our community service, involvement in the community and passion for our school. We chose the rounded font to be very unique and paired it with the all caps sans font for contrast. You can see the qualities of the font repeated in the rounded corners found in the graphics throughout the book. The bold color palette is unlike anything the Tigrium has done before and is meant to be consistent with the varied shapes and textures found within the graphics throughout the book. The images chosen for the thematic pages as well as dominate images showcase bold emotions -whether it be outwardly (yelling) or introspective (praying).

350 copies of full color, size nine, 258 pagebook were ordered for students, faculty, and staff. An additional 250 copies were printed to be used as national samples by the Balfour Publishing marketing department. The front and back end-sheets were custom designed by the staff. The book was printed

on 100 lb. matte stock, smyth sewn, rounded and backed on 150 lb. Binder's Board by Balfour Publishing in Dallas, Texas.

Advertisements were sold to the public, by our staff members, to cover production costs not met by book sales alone. Students were able to pre-order the books for \$90 through Sept. 22, and \$100 through Feb 1. Books, were available for purchase once delivered for \$105. Brass nameplates were offered for \$10 and included optional custom icons at an additional cost.

The staff designed cover, is matte lithocoat with emobossing debossing uv coat, soft touch and air touch finishes. The combination of colors, textures and graphics solidify the bold them and set a tone and voice for the book.

PRODUCTION AND DESIGN

The third and fourth-period, 23-person yearbook class and 38-person photography staff, produced and distributed Vol. 61 of the Tigrium. All pages were created and editing using Adobe InDesign, Photoshop, and Bridge CC on twenty 20' IMacs and two Macbook Pros. The staff was given templates created by the editors. Each page used a nine point grid with three degrees of separation to customize each layout. providing a complex yet uniform style. Variations of the fonts Tailwind, Rift, and Archer were used throughout for body copy, captions, headlines, subheadings and photo credits, Dean Stewart Photography (DSP) provided all professional photos.
