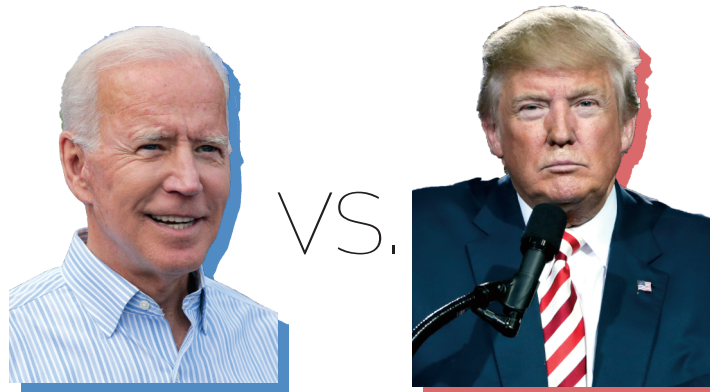
"I wanted Trump to win because I like that he was a business man before a politician, and I like him more than Biden," Gabe Hewett (8) said.

Nov. 7 at 8:49 p.m. Biden was declared the winner. The final electoral college vote was 306-232. Students had mixed opinions about the results.

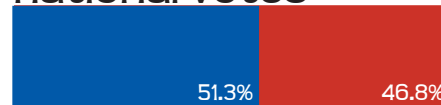

Kaylie Hawthorne (7) wanted Trump to win because that's who her parents voted for.

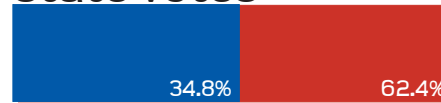
"I prefer Trump, but I do not know much about politics," Hawthorne said. "My parents support Trump so I just kind of go off of that."



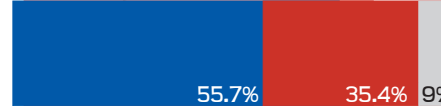
### national votes
