This was a year when every teacher in the district felt like a first-year teacher. A year when students missed out on normal milestone events and struggled to succeed in a Zoom universe. Then, a light at the end of the tunnel faintly appeared. After Governor Tim Walz announced that schools could return to in-person learning as early as March 8, the Stillwater school district committed to returning by that date, even though two weeks remained in the third quarter. Coming back turned out to be a warm-up for 4th quarter. Students got used to the building again, and teachers got used to having students in their classrooms. Many chose to remain on distance learning, so inperson classes didn't really change where teachers sat - in front of their computers, Zooming with the at-home students. The country was now under new leadership: President Joe Biden and Vice President Kamala Harris, the first female vicepresident in history. Biden pushed for the vaccination roll out, and the majority of the state's essential and education workers were vaccinated in February and March. Spring brought increased Covid cases as new variants of the virus appeared worldwide, and student infections spiked locally in the first weeks of April. We weren't out of this yet. We had to stay the course. So, Covid protocols continued. The prom committee planned an event at Pony Stadium for mid-June to ensure that Covid would not cancel this event a second time.
