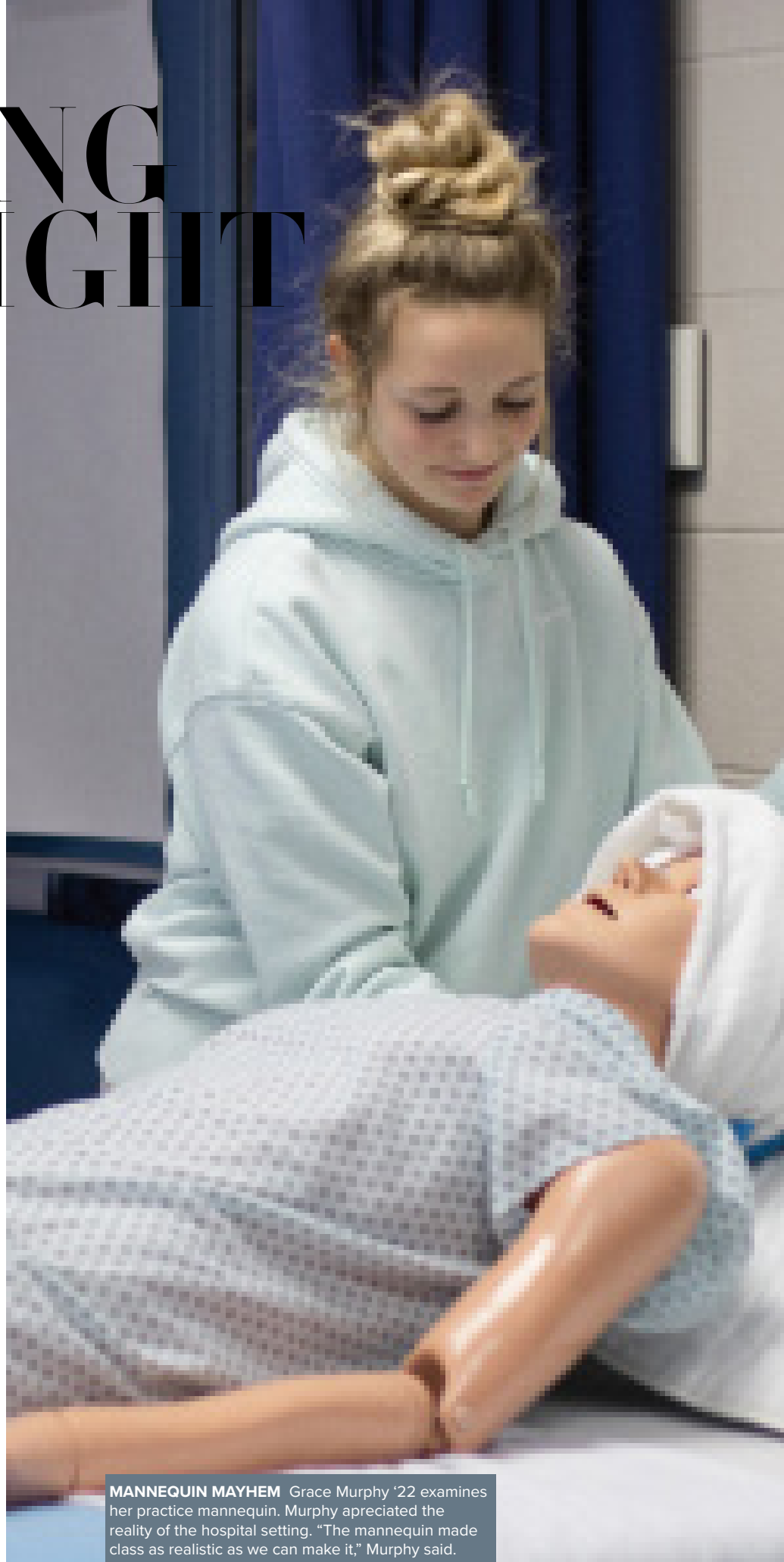
The hands on experience allows for an in depth learning experience for the entire class.
