"My favorite part they started construction much earlier, so the seniors would have been able to experience it in full, but it looks pretty good for the new students," **Kellen Chapman (12)** said.



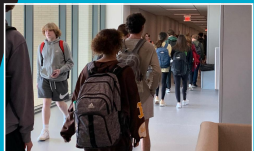

On Feb. 1, a weather balloon suspected to be from China entered United States airspace, flying over the country before being shot down shortly passing through North Carolina.

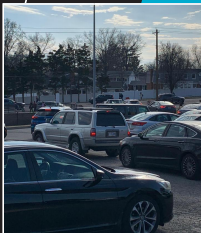

With construction taking place around the school, the parking spaces were limited.

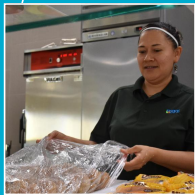

As ticket pre-sales began for Taylor Swift's "The Eras Tour," the Ticketmaster website was overwhelmed with traffic.

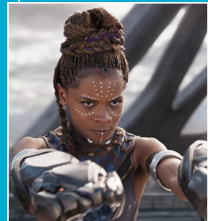
"It was one of the most stressful days of my life. I took off school, because I really wanted those tickets, and it took me nine hours to get them," **Kathryn Schultz (10)** said.
