Kansas City Chiefs win Super Bowl LVII against Philadelphia Eagles

THE NIGHT SKY LIT UP by colorful fireworks. Screams and pops interrupted the silent night of Feb. 12. Empty bowls of chips and cans of soda layed around the T.V. as families and friends embraced while jumping up and down, cheering as loud as they could.

The Kansas City Chiefs won Super Bowl LVII after defeating the Philadelphia Eagles 38-35, making this **the Chiefs third Super Bowl appearance and their second win in four years.**

“I think it shows that despite losing good players, and players getting injured, that we can still win,” sophomore Sophia Walcott said. “Hard work and practice pays off.”

Being named Super Bowl MVP, quarterback Patrick Mahomes was the first player to win regular season MVP and Super Bowl MVP in the same season since Kurt Warner in 1999.

“[Mahomes] deserved MVP because he had a bad ankle injury in a game where the opponent takes advantage of your injuries,” junior Christain Adams said. **“He still was extremely persistent and efficient in every drive on the field.”**

After suffering an ankle injury in the first game, kicker Harrison Butker kicked the game winning field goal. Working towards the same title, Chiefs tight end, Travis Kelce, played against his brother, Philadelphia center, Jason Kelce. Kelce made sure to keep fighting for his team and kept the game exciting.

“Most interesting part was the fumble halfway through the game,” senior Devin Freemanwhen said. “[Philadelphia quarterback, Jalen] Hurts was slammed, dropped the ball and then the Chiefs scored a touchdown.”

The halftime show was performed by Rihanna and featured songs such as We Found Love, Work and Diamonds. During the show, Rihanna announced her pregnancy with a bodysuit zipped down to reveal the singer’s bump.

“I thought it was amazing,” senior Jaida Diaz said. “A lot of people didn’t like it, but **Rihanna basically promoted her baby and her makeup line in 20 minutes with a bunch of good songs.**” *story by owen english*

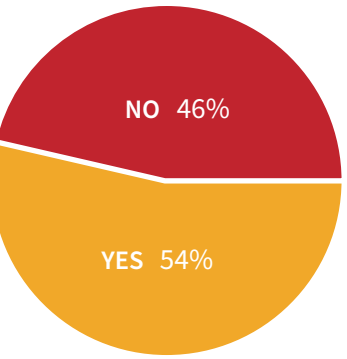

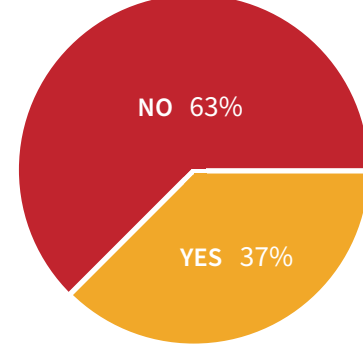

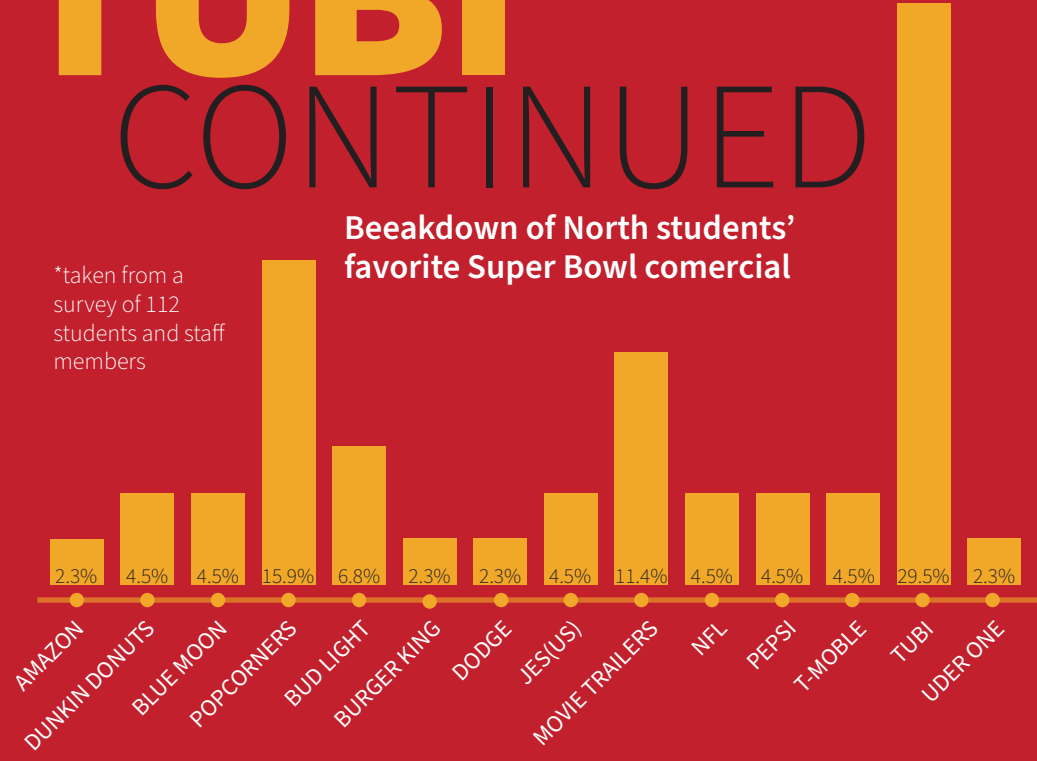
