

In honor of The Harvard Crimson's 150th anniversary this year, we planned and hosted a black-tie gala at the John F. Kennedy Presidential Library for the newspaper's alumni on April 29.

The event was wildly successful: More than 550 Crimson alumni traveled to Boston to attend the event. Crimson undergraduate volunteers handed out 500 copies of the week's special edition paper — which included an advertising supplement that generated \$14,400 — and the latest edition of the magazine. The gala was headlined by keynote panelists Joseph Kahn (NYT executive editor), Mary Louise Kelly (NPR host), Bill McKibben (350.org founder), Mark Whitaker (former Newsweek editor), and Amanda Bennett (Pulitzer Prize winner).

The event did not directly generate revenue — there were no sponsorships or advertisements sold — but over the weekend alumni donated \$13,929.01 to The Crimson, totaling 29 gifts. The gala was advertised to alumni via newsletter, starting in December 2022. Several alumni who attended praised the gala as more fun than their Harvard College reunions.


