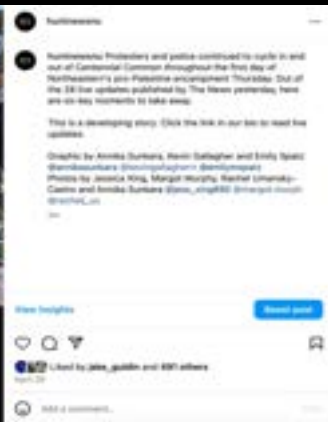
Helicopters from NBC10 Boston, Channel 5, WHDH and CBS Boston also circled campus, covering BPD's presence throughout the afternoon.

"If we all just appeared and set up tents we know that we would be in a lot of trouble, and it always feels like there's different rules that are being followed for us versus these other groups. We want them [the university] to take charge against them [encampment demonstrators] the same way they would any other group."

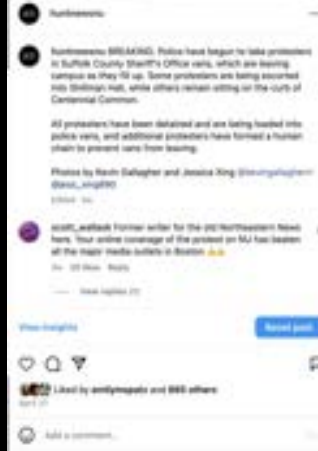
A protester inside the encampment appeared to be injured after falling to the ground.

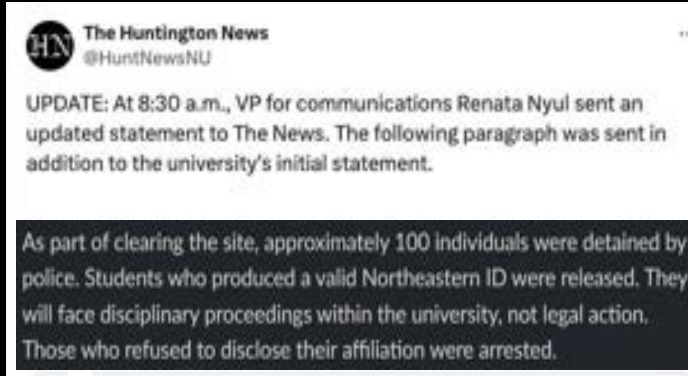

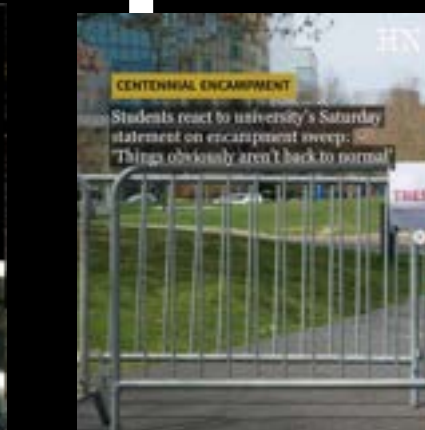

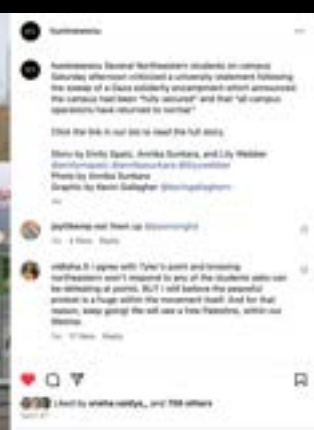

Following the arraignment of the first Northeastern encampment protester to be arrested, about a dozen Northeastern students held a press conference outside of Boston Municipal Court in Roxbury on Monday.

The students spoke about their outstanding demands for the university and their experiences with police during arrests.

Several speakers asked to be referred to only by their first name due to fear of retaliation.



"The truth is, genocide is a political purpose, and the university has a responsibility to tell us where our tuition dollars are going so that we are not invested in the slaughter of innocent people in Palestine."
