Multimedia Journalist of the Year Submission - Seyun Park

Personal Statement:

At the start of this year, I was a Print Editor-in-Chief for my school newspaper *The Pitch*. I had worked my way up from a staff writer to being a Print News Editor, and eventually to Print Editor-in-Chief. And print was all I had ever known. So for my first three years as a Pitch staff member, the concept of "multimedia" was foreign to me.

But this year, I expanded into creating online content and worked extensively on story packaging and boosting multimedia content to go along with our print content. My dive into online wasn't planned - it was more of a happy accident. I had written a breaking news story about our county's superintendent resigning that needed to be published as quickly as possible, and all of our online editors were busy or unavailable. To get the article online, I asked one of my online colleagues for the password to WordPress, macgyvered the story until it looked about right, and the rest was history.

From there, I started playing around with WordPress, learning about all the different ways we could incorporate multimedia into stories, much more than just a few basic photos I was used to working with print. I started using videos, photo galleries, polls, graphs, and audio in the stories I published.

With the elements unlocked by SNO Sites, our web hosting platform, I also explored using long-form stories and infobox stories, which were both story templates we had rarely, if ever, used before, always sticking to the simple full-width template. Even on stories that I didn't write, I helped to lay out better and more cohesive story packages like designing a long-form story reviewing products on TikTok shop and a long-form immersive photo gallery about our school play 'Les Miserables.' I used infoboxes for innovative online content like a news brief article which would have been thousands of words long for the six briefs but made much easier to read using the animated accordion infobox style.

This year, I also led a new effort in our newspaper to expand into live audio broadcasting, which we accomplished through The Pitch Radio Network, broadcasting certain sports games on the platform MixIr. We did live play-by-play this spring for baseball, softball, and lacrosse games including playoff games and I have incorporated some of these live audios into articles like for softball where we covered the game live and then I wrote the game story to go along with it.

My work with multimedia content was also the driving factor behind my promotion next year to Editor-in-Chief, leading both our print and online content, a position that has not existed in five years. WordPress is a confusing and complicated platform. And for the past few years, the extent of our multimedia online was a couple of extra images and a pull quote in some articles. But throughout this year, I have learned about the limitless possibilities of publishing content online, using embeds, and incorporating more than just text and a photo.




Back-and-forth game sends softball into first-ever state semifinal
