





According to their Facebook post, "The closure decision is based on predicted dangerously low wind chill temperatures of up to 20 below, with concerns particularly for our bus riders and walkers. thehuronemery On Sept. 13, 2023 the Ann Arbor Public School's school board of education passed a 5-2 vote to approve Superintendent Jeanice Swift's resignation agreement. The meeting took place at the district's Domino's Farms Building, where the board decided to remove Swift from her position.

"We all justifiably say we're doing what's best for kids," trustee Jeff Gaynor said. "We may disagree on what that looks like."

Swift will continue to work as superintendent until there is an interim or superintendent to take her place on Oct. 31, 2023. Additionally, Swift will serve as the "transition advisor" through Dec. 31, 2023, to the interim or permanent superintendent.

Due to the influence of social media and the great amount of attention this situation has received, the ambiguity around the superintendent position has led to lots of attention from the Ann Arbor public schools community.



thehuronemery The April 11 Ann Arbor Public Schools Board of Education meeting started with a protest by AAPS staff members outside of the Earhart Road Building. The rain did not stop teachers from chanting for about 30 minutes before the meeting. They continued into the building for the first five minutes of scheduled meeting time.

"We are teachers, and we are not the problem," they chanted. "Hey hey! Ho ho! The Balas Palace has got to go! Not our fault – it's yours!"

Many teachers also spoke during the Public Commentary.

"You can't just send out one survey to the community and have that be it," Clague Orchestra teacher Abigail Alwin said. "That was extremely, extremely insulting to all of us that our little teeny tiny raise that we got last year was the cause, one of the major causes of this problem. It is not our fault. You have to understand that our emotions are high for a reason."

There were 143 people signed up for Public Commentary. Many teachers who didn't want to give a whole speech also submitted statements to the Public Commentary, saying "I am an Ann Arbor teacher, and I am not the problem."


