Juniors and seniors can pay to park in the upper lot. Parking permits must be displayed on the rearview mirrors to avoid tickets.



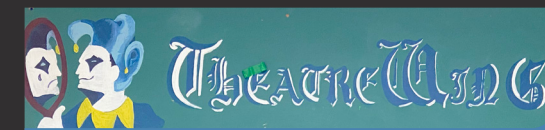
S MESL
