

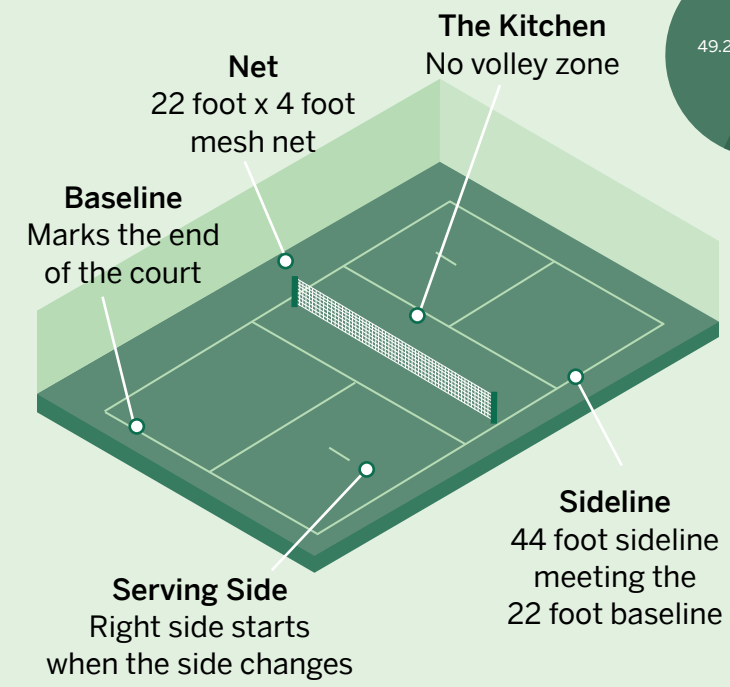

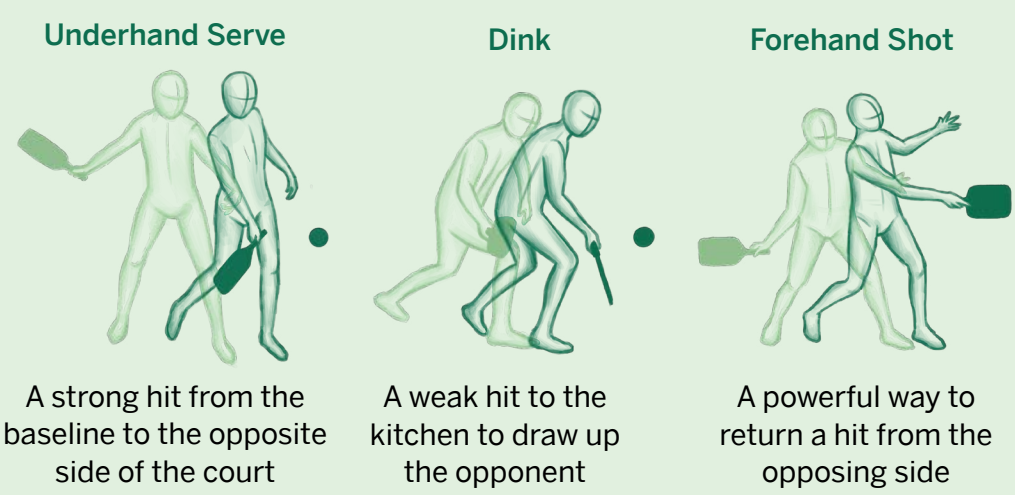
How to Move

Parts of the pickleball court



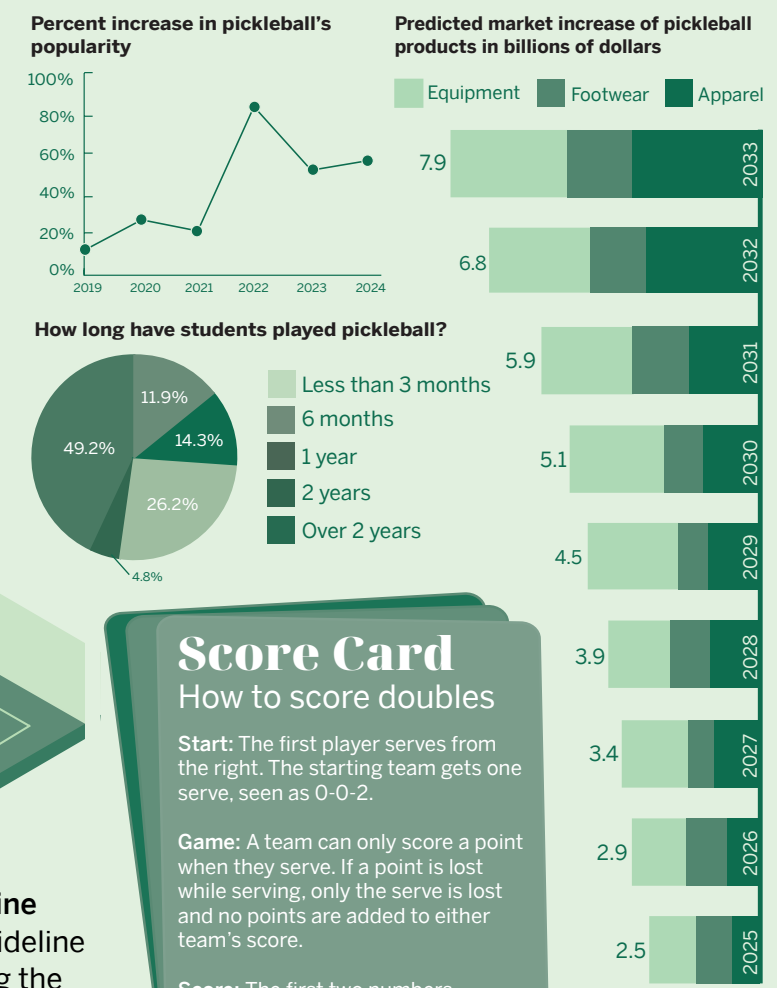
Mastering the Hits

How to score doubles

Start: The first player serves from the right. The starting team gets one serve, seen as 0-0-2.

Game: A team can only score a point when they serve. If a point is lost while serving, only the serve is lost and no points are added to either team's score.

Score: The first two numbers represent the points on each side. The third number is the amount of people who have served, one or two.

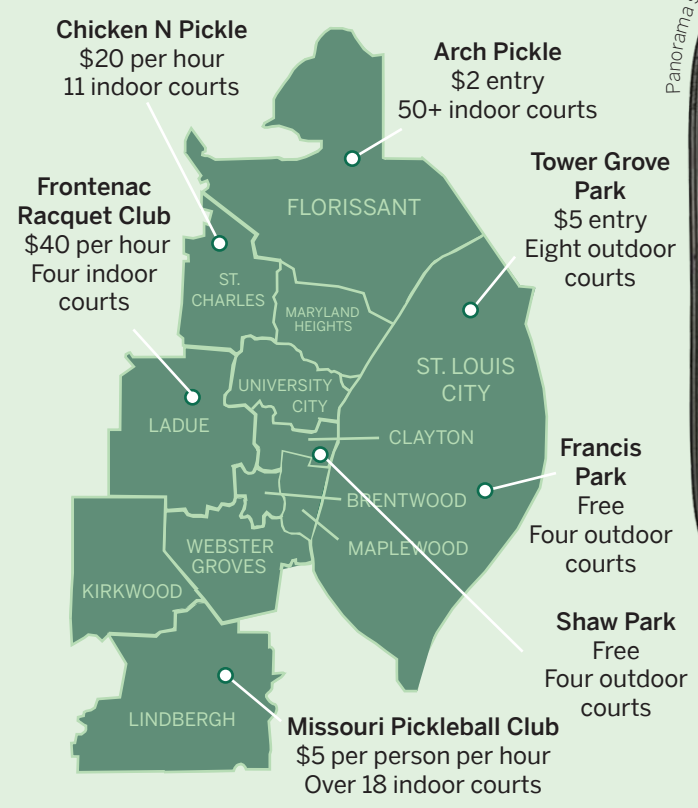
