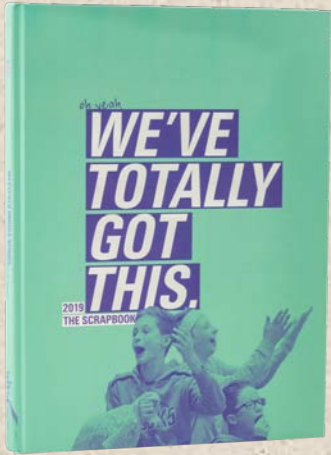

"It's the semifinals," Caden Alexander (7) said. "Oh man, I was sweating. I was Diddy Kong. The other guys were just killing me and racking up damage. I didn't know what to do; I was so scared. 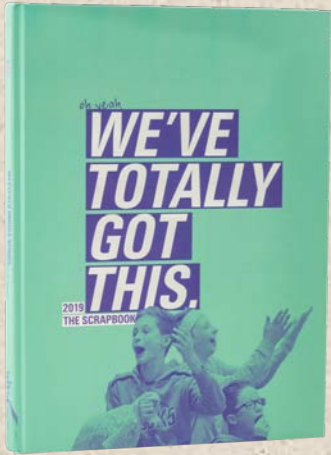

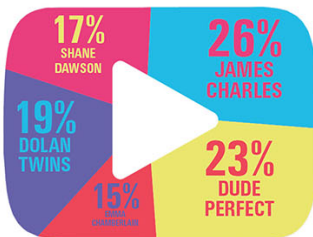

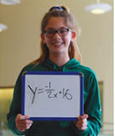

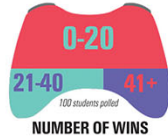

"I was at Sahn Golf Course in late September. I was getting ready to play golf when I heard someone shouting for help near the first hole. I looked over, and there was a guy flailing his arms around frantically. There was another guy on the ground not moving, so I ran over to them to see what was going on. I wanted to help. I checked his breathing, and he was not breathing. He didn't have a pulse. So, immediately I yelled at someone to call 911, and I started doing CPR. I was hoping the EMTs were going to arrive soon because I didn't know if I was doing CPR correctly, or if I was doing anything to help at all. I continued doing chest compressions until the EMTs arrived seven or eight minutes later. It was frantic. It's one of those things where you have training to do it, but it's been a year or so, and you don't know if you're doing things correctly. After they took him to the hospital, I was still shaking for the first four holes that I was golfing until I found out he was going to be okay. Since then, I've talked to him on the phone once about how he was doing, and if he was okay. He said that I separated one of his ribs doing the CPR. It's something that's supposed to happen. He said he'd take that any day over the alternative. We're planning on playing golf together this summer. It had been his first time being at that golf course, and everyone there was a complete stranger except for his son-in-law, who was the one who had been calling for help. It was pleasant to talk to him. I think that everyone should have to get CPR certified. I didn't arrive at the golf course thinking that I was going to perform CPR on anyone. You never know what can happen."

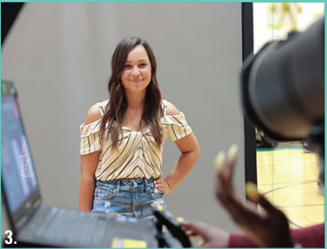
